Special Shows:

Celebration of the PP&M Era

Presenters may want to invite their audiences to dress up in the clothing of the era of Peter Paul and Mary. You might have Classic Car owners who would like to display their cars of the 1960s. Showing clips of movies of the 1960s and some artwork will bring back more memories. This will make your space transformed into an EVENT long-remembered by your patrons.

Photo Op

Ask your audience to send you photos of themselves as they looked in the 60s. These can be displayed as a slide show in back of Peter, Paul and Mary Remembered as they perform. At the end of their show the musicians will ask the people whose photos were shown during the performance to stand. This could give the show a real "personal, audience takes part" feeling.

Veterans Honored

In Honor of all Veterans, presenters could ask Veterans (in advance) to send in photos of their time in the military service. These will be shown on a screen in back of the performers as "special" songs are sung. This will bring to your audience, of all ages, the opportunity to see these men and women as they were at a time in the past and to relate to them now. At the end of their concert All Veterans will be asked to stand as a unique Honor will be offered to them. This would be a great show for Veteran's day or anytime of the year to honor these special people who gave so much to our country.
